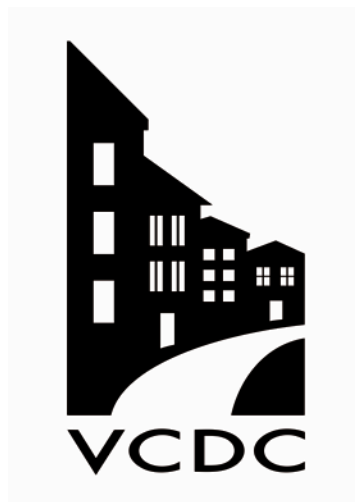

Housing Virginia's Rural Housing Initiative

Rural Virginia is changing, and with that, our rural affordable housing needs are in transition. Housing Virginia has been assessing demographic and housing trends by surveying local rural providers around the state to hear their most pressing needs and their perception of the changes happening in their communities.













Housing Virginia plans to use the information from these providers, along with housing data and best practice research, to develop an action plan to assist rural providers and improve the lives of their clients. We also hope this directory can better connect rural providers with each other.

About **34%** of Cost Burdened Households in Virginia are located in rural or semi-rural areas*.

That's **331,924** rural or semi-rural households that pay more than 30% of their income on housing alone.

Preliminary Survey Results

Virginia's rural housing providers understand the unique and growing pressures that their clients are facing, and they are struggling to serve them effectively as resources decline. Housing Virginia's survey of rural providers showed that:
