

# **State of Affordable Housing in King George County**







# King George County is rapidly growing.

Between 2000 and 2015, the County's population grew by 46% and is projected to increase by more than 5,000 additional residents by 2030.

# 31% of employees commute from homes outside the County.

This results in increased traffic and a lower tax base.

## New building supply remains low.


Single family home permits have stayed flat for the past five years at an average of just 105 permits annually.

# Homes under \$225K are limited and aged.

New construction for \$200K is nonexistent, and similar homes start at a price point of \$239K.
